HNM School Festival Pick-up and Drop-off Reminders:

The HNM Family Festival is next weekend, Friday 4/26-Sunday, 4/28! Set up for the Festival will be all next week, Monday through Friday. **THE MAIN PARKING LOT WILL BE CLOSED STARTING WEDNESDAY, AND DROP OFF AND DISMISSAL WILL BE IN THE SOUTH PARKING LOT (CARPOOL) ONLY.** Please represent HNM well, be patient, and do not block residents' driveways as you are waiting in line. Please do not cut-off families who are patiently waiting in line. Have your numbers ready in your cars.

- When we ask you to use the South Parking Lot, please do not come through the front gate in the Pavilion starting Wednesday. We do not have a crossing guard or staff there to protect your children. The festival committee will be busy setting up.
- Please make sure your School Speak emergency contact list is up to date. We cannot release your children if they are not on the emergency list.
- Be considerate of our neighbors and refrain from blocking driveways.
- Avoid cutting off other drivers on the road or in line.
- For PPK/PK students, please follow the specific instructions provided by Mrs. Montanez.
- For those volunteering in the classroom next week, starting Wednesday, kindly park in the south parking lot and report to the Health Room upon arrival.

Students will experience modified recesses and physical education sessions, ensuring their safety as they witness the Festival's setup unfold before them. It's an incredibly exciting time for them! Thank you to the parent volunteers who will be on campus ensuring the safety of all students, faculty, and staff.

OUTREACH CONCERN COUNSELING

IMPROVING YOUR CHILD/ADOLESCENTS' STUDY HABITS:

Motivation with schoolwork and homework begins at home. In order to bring about change in homework and learning habits, children and adolescents need positive communication, positive role modeling, and structure.

Positive communication brings about change. Talk with your daughter/son about goals that are reachable. Listen, validate, and offer help when there is something they have difficulty with.

Children and adolescents model their parents' behavior. As adults, we have "homework" too. There are certain tasks that we need to do and responsibilities we need to follow through on. By showing them responsible behavior, you are teaching them to take responsibility for their obligations as well.

IMPROVING YOUR CHILD/ADOLESCENTS' STUDY HABITS:

1. Set up a study area. Designate a specific area that is quiet and free from other household distractions that your daughter/son can always do their homework in.
2. Keep this area well stocked with paper, pencils, markers, staples, etc. If they are constantly getting up for something they become easily distracted.
3. If your children/adolescents are close in age, separate them while they are studying. Then you can help each one individually.
4. Find a study buddy - someone who's on the honor roll or excels in a subject your daughter/son is having difficulties in. Have them work together once or twice a week.
5. Check your daughter's/son's homework - but don't do it for them. Correct and explain it to them so they can do it correctly themselves.



6. If there is a subject that is more difficult for your daughter/son, discuss it with their teacher.
7. Read with your child. For adolescents, find a subject they are passionate about and find books for them to read on that topic or hobby.
8. For high school adolescents - it is important to set boundaries. For instance, no phone calls until after their homework is finished.
9. Ask adolescents intelligent, respectful questions such as, "Would you like to do your homework on Friday? That way you have the weekend free." If you phrase things in a positive way and give reasonable choices, it allows them to find solutions, invent different strategies, and have the confidence to carry them out.



GOOD JOB!!

Getting your daughter/son to do homework is a fundamental task. If they know you are there to help and support them, it becomes a positive learning experience instead of a chore they have to complete.



Our studies on the correlation between counseling and academics have been significant. If your daughter/son is experiencing difficulties, our counselors can help them by listening, offering advice, and devising learning and homework strategies. This usually results in an improvement in grades, which helps boost their self-esteem and sense of worth.

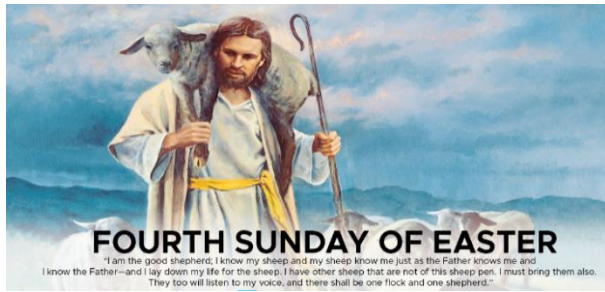

REFLECTING THE WORD

The Good Shepherd loves and cares for the sheep. He knows each of the sheep by name. He calls them and they follow his voice. How do we recognize the voice of the Good Shepherd amid the noise and competing voices in the world? We know the voice of the Good Shepherd because we have heard his great love for us.

The great self-sacrificing love that the Good Shepherd has for the sheep reminds us of the love that the parent has for the child.

.....ON THE WAY TO MASS.....

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that he is the Good Shepherd. What does a shepherd do? What do sheep need?

ON THE WAY HOME FROM MASS.....

The Good Shepherd calls us by name. We listen to his voice so that we can follow him. How far does his voice reach?

LIVING THE WORD

We listen to the Good Shepherd's voice and follow him. One of the ways we listen to his voice is by reading his Word. Spend time this week reading about the love and care of the Shepherd in Psalm 23. This psalm tells us that the Shepherd gives us everything we need, including comfort and courage when we are afraid. Have each member of your family illustrate a line from this psalm. Collect all the images to make a Psalm 23 booklet.
