

# **COVID-19 Prevention Program (CPP)**

This CPP is designed to control exposures to the SARS-CoV-2 virus that may occur in our workplace.

**Date: January 27, 2021** 

# **Authority and Responsibility**

**Deborah B Marquez, Principal,** has overall authority and responsibility for implementing the provisions of this CPP in our workplace. In addition, all managers and supervisors are responsible for implementing and maintaining the CPP in their assigned work areas and for ensuring employees receive answers to questions about the program in a language they understand.

All employees are responsible for using safe work practices, following all directives, policies and procedures, and assisting in maintaining a safe work environment.

## Identification and Evaluation of COVID-19 Hazards

We will implement the following in our workplace:

- Conduct workplace-specific evaluations using the **Appendix A: Identification of COVID-19 Hazards** form.
- Evaluate employees' potential workplace exposures to all persons at, or who may enter, our workplace.
- Review applicable orders and general and industry-specific guidance from the State of California, Cal/OSHA, and the local health department related to COVID-19 hazards and prevention.
- Evaluate existing COVID-19 prevention controls in our workplace and the need for different or additional controls.
- Conduct periodic inspections using the Appendix B: COVID-19 Inspections form as needed
  to identify unhealthy conditions, work practices, and work procedures related to COVID-19 and
  to ensure compliance with our COVID-19 policies and procedures.

#### **Employee participation**

Employees and their authorized employees' representatives are encouraged to participate in the identification and evaluation of COVID-19 hazards by: Employees are requested to follow protocols as well as to inform administration should they see an individual disregarding safety protocols.

#### **Employee screening**

All employees are required to self screen using a Google form according to CDPH guidelines prior to coming onto the campus. The Health Room Coordinator monitors the Google form to ensure each employee has completed this task. Once arriving on campus, teachers and staff are to come

to the front office to get their temperatures taken by the office personnel. A non-contact thermometer is used. Face coverings are required to be worn at all times by all personnel from the moment they arrive on campus.

#### Correction of COVID-19 Hazards

Unsafe or unhealthy work conditions, practices or procedures will be documented on the **Appendix B: COVID-19 Inspections** form, and corrected in a timely manner based on the severity of the hazards, as follows: Depending upon the issue, a person will be assigned according to the skills needed. Information regarding assessment of hazards, correction times, and individuals assigned to correct are recorded on Appendix B. As situations occur, the individuals listed will be notified and dates assigned. (*Refer to Appendix B*)

#### Control of COVID-19 Hazards

## **Physical Distancing**

Where possible, we ensure at least six feet of physical distancing at all times in our workplace by:

In order to maintain a distance of six feet between students and staff whenever possible, certain alterations have been made to classrooms, hallways, restrooms, and other common spaces. Classroom capacity has been reduced. There is six feet of separation between seats in classrooms and common areas. Excess furniture has been removed from classrooms, lounges, and common areas.

Plexiglas shields have been installed in school offices and healthroom. Signage and floor stickers will be used to help identify the flow of traffic in and out of the classrooms and buildings. In the Junior Building the flow will be: entering from east on the north side of the hallway and exiting from west to east on the southside of the hall. In the senior building, students will access the bathroom by leaving their classrooms on the outside and maintaining a six foot distance from other students or teachers they encounter. Parents and any other visitors to campus will remain outside of the buildings unless they have an appointment.

Individuals will be kept as far apart as possible when there are situations where six feet of physical distancing cannot be achieved.

#### Face Coverings

We provide clean, undamaged face coverings and ensure they are properly worn by employees over the nose and mouth when indoors, and when outdoors and less than six feet away from another person, including non-employees, and where required by orders from the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) or local health department. Students are required to wear approved masks at all times and remove only to eat or drink. Students are to provide their own masks; however, the school has adequate supply to hand out if masks are dirty, broken, or lost. Employees will be provided medical grade disposable masks. Holy Name of Mary School has an adequate supply for the school year 2020-2021. The school has a closed campus. Visitors and parents have limited access. Any individual on the campus without a mask will be asked to put a mask on or leave the area. Employees will notify the school administration through the walkietalkie system should they witness someone on campus without a mask.

The following are exceptions to the use of face coverings in our workplace:

- When an employee is alone in a room
- While eating and drinking at the workplace, provided employees are at least six feet apart and outside air supply to the area, if indoors, has been maximized to the extent possible

- Employees who cannot wear face coverings due to a medical or mental health condition or disability, or who are hearing-impaired or communicating with a hearing-impaired person. Alternatives will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
- Specific tasks that cannot feasibly be performed with a face covering, where employees will be kept at least six feet apart

Any employee not wearing a face covering, face shield with a drape or other effective alternative, or respiratory protection, for any reason, shall be at least six feet apart from all other persons unless the unmasked employee is tested at least twice weekly for COVID-19.

#### **Engineering Controls**

We implement the following measures for situations where we cannot maintain at least six feet between individuals: Areas for line up are marked; areas for play are indicated, numbered and assigned on the field and basketball court. Desks are six feet apart and outlined with blue tape. Partitions are placed around office desks. Masks will be worn at all times.

We maximize, to the extent feasible, the quantity of outside air for our buildings with mechanical or natural ventilation systems by:

- In the case of outside hazards such as heat and wildfire, the windows and doors will be closed
  for the amount of time necessary to keep children safe from heat and unhealthy air
  quality. The new air conditioning system will be able to properly ventilate the classrooms. The
  school day may have to be shortened or canceled if poor air quality will last for an extended
  period.
- The entire school's air conditioning system was replaced and is up and functioning as of January 2021. This includes updated ducting, ventilation and air flow.
- The new air conditioning systems exceed current codes and have increased the filtration efficiency significantly.

#### **Cleaning and Disinfecting**

We implement the following cleaning and disinfection measures for frequently touched surfaces:

- Ensuring adequate supplies and adequate time for it to be done properly.
- Providing training on the proper use of disinfectants
- Informing the employees and authorized employee representatives of the frequency and scope of cleaning and disinfection

Should we have a COVID-19 case in our workplace, we will implement the following procedures:

- The Custodian will come into the affected area 24 hours after the symptomatic person or student
  has left. The room, walls, and area within 6 feet of where the person was will be sprayed using an
  electrostatic sprayer as well as floors being sanitized and mopped.
- SDS sheets are on file in the school office for approved disinfectants.
- Custodians have access to gloves, gowns, safety goggles and masks.
- Staff has been trained on safety and the use of disinfectants.

#### Shared tools, equipment and personal protective equipment (PPE)

PPE will not be shared, e.g., gloves, goggles and face shields.

Items that employees come in regular physical contact with, such as phones, headsets, desks, keyboards, writing materials, instruments and tools must also not be shared, to the extent feasible. Where there must be sharing, the items will be disinfected between uses.

#### **Hand Sanitizing**

After evaluation and meetings with our HNM Safety Task force we have implemented effective hand sanitizing procedures. We added two more hand- sanitizing stations which are located at the two entrances to the school on the west side of the buildings. An additional six hand sanitizing stations were placed around the campus. Extra hand sanitizing supplies will be available in each classroom and office.

#### HAND SANITIZERS

Students, faculty and staff and visitors will be required to wash their hands or sanitize their hands before entering the school building each day and before entering a new classroom or location when moving within the building. There are now five hand washing stations at the school – two each in front of the senior and junior buildings and one at the front gate. Two hand sanitizing stations are located at the two entrances to the school on the west side of the buildings. Extra hand sanitizing supplies will be available in each classroom and office.

The hand sanitizing product being used at school meets the minimum 62% alcohol threshold recommended by the CDC.

- Adults will always supervise the use of hand sanitizers by children.
- Hand sanitizer is available in every classroom.
- Hand Sanitizers should only be used when hand washing with soap and water is not readily available.

#### HAND HYGIENE

- Wash your hands often and follow the following five steps every time:
- Wet your hands with clean, running water (warm or cold), turn off the tap, and apply soap
- Lather your hands by rubbing them together with the soap.
- Lather the backs of your hands, between your fingers, and under your nails.
- Scrub your hands for at least 20 seconds.
- Need a timer? Sing the birthday song from beginning to end twice.
- Rinse your hands well under clean, running water.
- Dry your hands using a clean towel.
- Wash your hands often especially after you have been in a public pace, after blowing your nose, coughing, sneezing, before eating or preparing food, before touching your face, after using the restroom, after leaving a public place, after handling your mask, after changing a diaper, after caring for someone sick, and after touching animals or pets.
- If soap and water is not readily available, use hand sanitizer that contains at
- least 60% alcohol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until
- they feel dry. Only use hand sanitizer if you cannot readily wash your hands with soap and water. Handwashing is best and the most effective.

Handwashing signs are posted to remind staff and students.

#### Personal protective equipment (PPE) used to control employees' exposure to COVID-19

We evaluate the need for PPE (such as gloves, goggles, and face shields) as required by CCR Title 8, section 3380, and provide such PPE as needed.

When it comes to respiratory protection, we evaluate the need in accordance with CCR Title 8 section 5144 when the physical distancing requirements are not feasible or maintained. We provide and ensure use of eye protection and respiratory protection in accordance with section 5144 when employees are exposed to procedures that may have aerosolized potentially infectious material such as saliva or respiratory tract fluids.

# Investigating and Responding to COVID-19 Cases

This will be accomplished by using the **Appendix C: Investigating COVID-19 Cases** form.

After a confirmed case is reported, our safety protocols will be followed and the information about the case(s) will be appropriately shared with the school community. Leadership will send an email to all cohorts which were exposed with the guidelines and protocols to follow. Leadership will notify the entire school community of any positive cases on campus. Confidentiality will be maintained under the requirement of federal HIPPA laws.

Employees who had potential COVID-19 exposure in our workplace will be:

- Offered COVID Testing at no cost during working hours will be available through the LA COUNTY location: https://covid19.lacounty.gov/testing/ OR they can order an at-home test kit at: -https://www.pixel.labcorp.com/at-home-test-kits/covid-19-test-home-collection-kit
- Monthly surveillance testing is in the final stages of adoption
- The information on benefits described in Training and instruction, and Exclusion of COVID-19 cases, below, will be provided to them.

# **System for Communicating**

Our goal is to ensure that we have effective two-way communication with our employees, in a form they can readily understand, and that it includes the following information:

- Employees should report COVID-19 symptoms and possible hazards to the leadership team by both text and email. To ensure fidelity staff members are asked to email the administrative team when exposed and if/when they receive a positive or negative test they are asked to send a digital copy.
- That employees can report symptoms and hazards without fear of reprisal.
- Our procedures or policies for accommodating employees with medical or other conditions that
  put them at increased risk of severe COVID-19 illness. Staff members are asked to contact the
  principal, Deborah Marquez if they are looking for accommodations for a medical condition in
  order to work collaboratively.
- Where testing is not required, how employees can access COVID-19 testing. Employees have been given a variety of links to access testing as well as the link to an online order. https://www.pixel.labcorp.com/at-home-test-kits/covid-19-test-home-collection-kit.
- In the event we are required to provide testing because of a workplace exposure or outbreak,
  we will communicate the plan for providing testing and inform affected employees of the
  reason for the testing and the possible consequences of a positive test. (This is where we
  would place the company name that will be coming in to test.) Information about COVID-19
  hazards employees (including other employers and individuals in contact with our workplace)
  may be exposed to, what is being done to control those hazards, and our COVID-19 policies
  and procedures.

# **Training and Instruction**

We will provide effective training and instruction that includes:

- Our COVID-19 policies and procedures to protect employees from COVID-19 hazards.
- Information regarding COVID-19-related benefits to which the employee may be entitled under applicable federal, state, or local laws.
- The fact that:
  - COVID-19 is an infectious disease that can be spread through the air.
  - COVID-19 may be transmitted when a person touches a contaminated object and then touches their eyes, nose, or mouth.
  - An infectious person may have no symptoms.
- Methods of physical distancing of at least six feet and the importance of combining physical distancing with the wearing of face coverings.
- The fact that particles containing the virus can travel more than six feet, especially indoors, so
  physical distancing must be combined with other controls, including face coverings and hand
  hygiene, to be effective.
- The importance of frequent hand washing with soap and water for at least 20 seconds and using hand sanitizer when employees do not have immediate access to a sink or hand washing facility, and that hand sanitizer does not work if the hands are soiled.
- Proper use of face coverings and the fact that face coverings are not respiratory protective
  equipment face coverings are intended to primarily protect other individuals from the wearer
  of the face covering.
- COVID-19 symptoms, and the importance of obtaining a COVID-19 test and not coming to work
  if the employee has COVID-19 symptoms.
- Appendix D: COVID-19 Training Roster will be used to document this training.

#### **Exclusion of COVID-19 Cases**

Where we have a COVID-19 case in our workplace, we will limit transmission by:

- Ensuring that COVID-19 cases are excluded from the workplace until our return-to-work requirements are met.
- Excluding employees with COVID-19 exposure from the workplace for 14 days after the last known COVID-19 exposure to a COVID-19 case.
- Continuing and maintaining an employee's earnings, seniority, and all other employee rights
  and benefits whenever we've demonstrated that the COVID-19 exposure is work related. This
  will be accomplished by The school has been following the rules of the Families First
  Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA or Act) which provided employees with paid sick leave or
  expanded family and medical leave for specified reasons related to COVID-19 which was in
  effect until December 31, 2020. We continue to keep current with the government information
  and policies. We also follow FMLA policies, and Leave of Absence and Sick Time policies per
  our Archdiocese handbook.
- Providing employees at the time of exclusion with information on available benefits.

# Reporting, Recordkeeping, and Access

It is our policy to:

 Report information about COVID-19 cases at our workplace to the local health department whenever required by law, and provide any related information requested by the local health department.

- Report immediately to Cal/OSHA any COVID-19-related serious illnesses or death, as defined under CCR Title 8 section 330(h), of an employee occurring in our place of employment or in connection with any employment.
- Maintain records of the steps taken to implement our written COVID-19 Prevention Program in accordance with CCR Title 8 section 3203(b).
- Make our written COVID-19 Prevention Program available at the workplace to employees, authorized employee representatives, and to representatives of Cal/OSHA immediately upon request.
- Use the Appendix C: Investigating COVID-19 Cases form to keep a record of and track all COVID-19 cases. The information will be made available to employees, authorized employee representatives, or as otherwise required by law, with personal identifying information removed.
- Notify Archdiocese personnel as per instructed by the Department of Catholic Schools.

#### Return-to-Work Criteria

- COVID-19 cases with COVID-19 symptoms will not return to work until all the following have occurred:
  - At least 24 hours have passed since a fever of 100.4 or higher has resolved without the use of fever-reducing medications.
  - COVID-19 symptoms have improved.
  - At least 10 days have passed since COVID-19 symptoms first appeared.
- COVID-19 cases who tested positive but never developed COVID-19 symptoms will not return
  to work until a minimum of 10 days have passed since the date of specimen collection of their
  first positive COVID-19 test.
- A negative COVID-19 test will not be required for an employee to return to work.
- If an order to isolate or quarantine an employee is issued by a local or state health official, the
  employee will not return to work until the period of isolation or quarantine is completed or the
  order is lifted. If no period was specified, then the period will be 10 days from the time the
  order to isolate was effective, or 14 days from the time the order to quarantine was effective.

## Appendix A: Identification of COVID-19 Hazards Form

All persons, regardless of symptoms or negative COVID-19 test results, will be considered potentially infectious. Particular attention will be paid to areas where people may congregate or come in contact with one another, regardless of whether employees are performing an assigned work task or not. For example: meetings, entrances, bathrooms, hallways, aisles, walkways, elevators, break or eating areas, cool-down areas, and waiting areas.

Evaluation of potential workplace exposure will be to all persons at the workplace or who may enter the workplace, including coworkers, employees of other entities, members of the public, customers or clients, and independent contractors. We will consider how employees and other persons enter, leave, and travel through the workplace, in addition to addressing fixed work locations.

All personal identifying information of COVID-19 cases or symptoms will be kept confidential. All COVID-19 testing or related medical services provided by us will be provided in a manner that ensures the confidentiality of employees, with the exception of unredacted information on COVID-19 cases that will be provided immediately upon request to the local health department, CDPH, Cal/OSHA, the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), or as otherwise required by law.

All employees' medical records will also be kept confidential and not disclosed or reported without the employee's express written consent to any person within or outside the workplace, with the following exceptions: (1) Unredacted medical records provided to the local health department, CDPH, Cal/OSHA, NIOSH, or as otherwise required by law immediately upon request; and (2) Records that do not contain individually identifiable medical information or from which individually identifiable medical information has been removed.

### **Additional Consideration #1**

# Multiple COVID-19 Infections and COVID-19 Outbreaks

This section of CPP will stay in effect until there are no new COVID-19 cases detected in our workplace for a 14-day period.

#### **COVID-19 testing**

- We will provide COVID-19 testing to all employees in our exposed workplace except for employees who were not present during the period of an outbreak identified by a local health department or the relevant 14-day period. COVID-19 testing will be provided at no cost to employees during employees' working hours.
- COVID-19 testing consists of the following:
  - All employees in our exposed workplace will be immediately tested and then tested again
    one week later. Negative COVID-19 test results of employees with COVID-19 exposure will
    not impact the duration of any quarantine period required by, or orders issued by, the local
    health department.
  - After the first two COVID-19 tests, we will continue to provide COVID-19 testing of employees who remain at the workplace at least once per week, or more frequently if recommended by the local health department, until there are no new COVID-19 cases detected in our workplace for a 14-day period.
  - We will provide additional testing when deemed necessary by Cal/OSHA.

#### **Exclusion of COVID-19 cases**

We will ensure COVID-19 cases and employees who had COVID-19 exposure are excluded from the workplace in accordance with our CPP **Exclusion of COVID-19 Cases** and **Return to Work Criteria** requirements, and local health officer orders if applicable.

#### Investigation of workplace COVID-19 illness

We will immediately investigate and determine possible workplace-related factors that contributed to the COVID-19 outbreak in accordance with our CPP **Investigating and Responding to COVID-19 Cases**.

#### COVID-19 investigation, review and hazard correction

In addition to our CPP Identification and Evaluation of COVID-19 Hazards and Correction of COVID-19 Hazards, we will immediately perform a review of potentially relevant COVID-19 policies, procedures, and controls and implement changes as needed to prevent further spread of COVID-19.

The investigation and review will be documented and include:

- Investigation of new or unabated COVID-19 hazards including:
  - Our leave policies and practices and whether employees are discouraged from remaining home when sick.
  - Our COVID-19 testing policies.
  - Insufficient outdoor air.
  - o Insufficient air filtration.
  - Lack of physical distancing.
- Updating the review:
  - Every thirty days that the outbreak continues.
  - o In response to new information or to new or previously unrecognized COVID-19 hazards.
  - When otherwise necessary.

- Implementing changes to reduce the transmission of COVID-19 based on the investigation and review. We will consider:
  - Moving indoor tasks outdoors or having them performed remotely.
  - Increasing outdoor air supply when work is done indoors.
  - o Improving air filtration.
  - Increasing physical distancing as much as possible.
  - o Respiratory protection.

#### Notifications to the local health department

- Immediately, but no longer than 48 hours after learning of three or more COVID-19 cases in our
  workplace, we will contact the local health department for guidance on preventing the further
  spread of COVID-19 within the workplace.
- We will provide to the local health department the total number of COVID-19 cases and for each COVID-19 case, the name, contact information, occupation, workplace location, business address, the hospitalization and/or fatality status, and North American Industry Classification System code of the workplace of the COVID-19 case, and any other information requested by the local health department. We will continue to give notice to the local health department of any subsequent COVID-19 cases at our workplace.

#### Additional Consideration #2

# Major COVID-19 Outbreaks

This section of CPP will stay in effect until there are no new COVID-19 cases detected in our workplace for a 14-day period.

#### **COVID-19 testing**

We will provide twice a week COVID-19 testing, or more frequently if recommended by the local health department, to all employees present at our exposed workplace during the relevant 30-day period(s) and who remain at the workplace. COVID-19 testing will be provided at no cost to employees during employees' working hours.

#### **Exclusion of COVID-19 cases**

We will ensure COVID-19 cases and employees with COVID-19 exposure are excluded from the workplace in accordance with our CPP Exclusion of COVID-19 Cases and Return to Work Criteria, and any relevant local health department orders.

#### Investigation of workplace COVID-19 illnesses

We will comply with the requirements of our CPP Investigating and Responding to COVID-19 Cases.

#### **COVID-19 hazard correction**

In addition to the requirements of our CPP Correction of COVID-19 Hazards, we will take the following actions:

 In buildings or structures with mechanical ventilation, we will filter recirculated air with Minimum Efficiency Reporting Value (MERV) 13 or higher efficiency filters if compatible with the ventilation system. If MERV-13 or higher filters are not compatible with the ventilation system, we will use filters with the highest compatible filtering efficiency. We will also evaluate whether portable or mounted High Efficiency Particulate Air (HEPA) filtration units, or other air cleaning systems would reduce the risk of transmission and implement their use to the degree feasible.

- We will determine the need for a respiratory protection program or changes to an existing respiratory protection program under CCR Title 8 section 5144 to address COVID-19 hazards.
- We will evaluate whether to halt some or all operations at our workplace until COVID-19 hazards have been corrected
- Implement any other control measures deemed necessary by Cal/OSHA.

#### Notifications to the local health department

We will comply with the requirements of our **Multiple COVID-19 Infections** and **COVID-19 Outbreaks-Notifications to the Local Health Department.**

# **COVID-19 Prevention in Employer-Provided Housing**

#### Assignment of housing units

We will ensure that shared housing unit assignments are prioritized in the following order:

- Residents who usually maintain a household together outside of work, such as family members, will be housed in the same housing unit without other persons.
- Residents who work in the same crew or work together at the same worksite will be housed in the same housing unit without other persons.
- Employees who do not usually maintain a common household, work crew, or worksite will be housed in the same housing unit only when no other housing alternatives are possible.

#### Physical distancing and controls

We will ensure:

- The premises are of sufficient size and layout to permit at least six feet of physical distancing between residents in housing units, common areas, and other areas of the premises.
- Beds are spaced at least six feet apart in all directions and positioned to maximize the distance between sleepers' heads. For beds positioned next to each other, i.e., side by side, the beds will be arranged so that the head of one bed is next to the foot of the next bed. For beds positioned across from each other, i.e., end to end, the beds will be arranged so that the foot of one bed is closest to the foot of the next bed. Bunk beds will not be used.
- Maximization of the quantity and supply of outdoor air and increase filtration efficiency to the highest level compatible with the existing ventilation system in housing units.

#### **Face coverings**

We will provide face coverings to all residents and provide information to residents on when they should be used in accordance with state or local health officer orders or guidance.

#### Cleaning and disinfection

We will ensure that:

Housing units, kitchens, bathrooms, and common areas are effectively cleaned and disinfected
at least once a day to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Cleaning and disinfecting shall be
done in a manner that protects the privacy of residents.

• Unwashed dishes, drinking glasses, cups, eating utensils, and similar items are not shared.

#### Screening

We will encourage residents to report COVID-19 symptoms to enter name of individual, position, or office.

#### **COVID-19 testing**

We will establish, implement, and maintain effective policies and procedures for COVID-19 testing of occupants who had a COVID-19 exposure, who have COVID-19 symptoms, or as recommended by the local health department.

#### Isolation of COVID-19 cases and persons with COVID-19 exposure

We will:

- Effectively isolate COVID-19 exposed residents from all other occupants. Effective isolation will
  include providing COVID-19 exposed residents with a private bathroom, sleeping area, and
  cooking and eating facility.
- Effectively isolate COVID-19 cases from all occupants who are not COVID-19 cases. Effective
  isolation will include housing COVID-19 cases only with other COVID-19 cases, and providing
  COVID-19 case occupants with a sleeping area, bathroom, and cooking and eating facility that
  is not shared by non-COVID-19-case occupants.
- Keep confidential any personal identifying information regarding COVID-19 cases and persons with COVID-19 symptoms, in accordance with our CPP Investigating and Responding to COVID-19 Cases.
- End isolation in accordance with our CPP Exclusion of COVID-19 Cases and Return to Work Criteria, and any applicable local or state health officer orders.

# COVID-19 Prevention in Employer-Provided Transportation to and from Work

#### Assignment of transportation

We will prioritize shared transportation assignments in the following order:

- Employees residing in the same housing unit will be transported in the same vehicle.
- Employees working in the same crew or worksite will be transported in the same vehicle.
- Employees who do not share the same household, work crew or worksite will be transported in the same vehicle only when no other transportation alternatives are possible.

#### Physical distancing and face coverings

We will ensure that the:

- Physical distancing and face covering requirements of our CPP Physical Distancing and Face Coverings are followed for employees waiting for transportation.
- Vehicle operator and any passengers are separated by at least three feet in all directions during
  the operation of the vehicle, regardless of the vehicle's normal capacity. Vehicle operator and
  any passengers are provided and wear a face covering in the vehicle as required by our CPP
  Face Coverings.

#### Screening

We will develop, implement, and maintain effective procedures for screening and excluding drivers and riders with COVID-19 symptoms prior to boarding shared transportation.

## Cleaning and disinfecting

We will ensure that:

- All high-contact surfaces (door handles, seatbelt buckles, armrests, etc.) used by passengers are cleaned and disinfected before each trip.
- All high-contact surfaces used by drivers, such as the steering wheel, armrests, seatbelt buckles, door handles and shifter, are cleaned and disinfected between different drivers.
- We provide sanitizing materials, training on how to use them properly, and ensure they are kept in adequate supply.

#### Ventilation

We will ensure that vehicle windows are kept open, and the ventilation system set to maximize outdoor air and not set to recirculate air. Windows do not have to be kept open if one or more of the following conditions exist:

- The vehicle has functioning air conditioning in use and the outside temperature is greater than 90 degrees Fahrenheit.
- The vehicle has functioning heating in use and the outside temperature is less than 60 degrees Fahrenheit.
- Protection is needed from weather conditions, such as rain or snow.
- The vehicle has a cabin air filter in use and the U.S. EPA Air Quality Index for any pollutant is greater than 100.

#### Hand hygiene

We will provide hand sanitizer in each vehicle and ensure that all drivers and riders sanitize their hands before entering and exiting the vehicle. Hand sanitizers with methyl alcohol are prohibited.
